## Conference: Changes to the Tribunal System - the new two-tier system and its implications

Date: Monday 14 June 2010 / Location: Legal Services Agency, Glasgow

On 3rd November 2008 the Tribunals Service experienced its most radical change in 50 years when key aspects of the Tribunals, Courts and Enforcement Act 2007 were implemented. Individual tribunals in the reserved jurisdictions have been brought together into a two-tier system. On 15th February 2010, the former Asylum and Immigration Tribunal was abolished and its functions were transferred to the new two-tier system.

The purpose of this seminar is to explore the reform, specifically:

- o the background to the reform;
- o broader changes to administrative justice;
- o multi-jurisdictional working and cross-border issues; and
- o implications for practice, specifically in relation to asylum and immigration appeals, social security appeals and criminal injuries compensation appeals
