At this Taxation, (which holds the record for "furthest North"!) there were several points at issue; the case involved a who was accused of embezzling funds from a Play Group; the circumstances were rather similar to those in the notorious case of H.M.A. -v- Hamill; an amateur organisation with subscriptions being paid irregularly, books in a mess, money left lying around in unlocked cupboards, etc. Obviously a case where the Crown would have had difficulty in establishing guilt, though in the end they failed even to establish a crime in respect that part of the Crown's case rested on an "unexplained" deficit in the Play Group's bank account, and the Crown failed to prove what the balance in the bank account was at the date

The first point to arise was preparation; 10 hours pre-Trial preparation was claimed for, and the Auditor allowed 6, which is probably reasonable. The Auditor also allowed 1 hour's preparation on each day of the Trial.

The main point was the employment of an unqualified assistant at the Trial taking notes. The Solicitor concerned, Mr. Milton, had sought prior approval from Aberdeen Committee who had referred the matter to us; members may recall my 'phoning round and discussing the case with them at that time (6-8 months ago) and some further discussion we had in the Sub-Committee meeting. We came to the view that we had no authority to either grant or refuse the employment of an additional person at the Trial.

The Solicitor argued that the presence of an unqualified assistant throughout was essential; the case was a long one (6 days) and there were many points of evidence which were brought out in cross examination which it had not been possible to elicit during precognition. The Auditor was plainly sympathetic to Mr. Milton's submissions, and I suggested that in that event, if the Auditor was minded to allow any part of the Clerk's attendance, it should be restricted at least to the cross examination of material witnesses, excluding evidence in chief and formal witnesses, and I suggested one half hour. The Auditor decided to allow three quarters of the claim, but agreed after a further submission from myself that the 25% increase under 13(6) should not apply to the unqualified person's attendance.
