### Case Background

The account lodged for taxation relates to solemn proceedings arising from a charge of attempted rape. The solicitor was at all times providing criminal legal aid and the reasonable fees incurred by the solicitor are payable from the Fund in terms of the Legal Aid (Scotland) Act 1986 and the relevant regulations.

### **Nature of Dispute**

It is understood that the items in dispute are as follows:

- 30 August 2010 (page 9 of account): block fee for client in custody £304; and
- 14 September 2010 (page 9 of account): block fee for deferred sentence £114.

The circumstances in which these claims have been rejected are explained below.

### The relevant regulations

This is the first diet of taxation to a ise from the Criminal Legal Aid (Scotland) (Fees) Amendment (No.2) Regulations 2010 [S.S.I., 2010 No. 212]. These regulations amended the previous Schedule 1 (fees of solicitors) by

prescribing detailed Notes on the operation of Schedule 1;

 splitting up the previous Schedule 1 by prescribing a new Part I (detailed fees) and Part II (inclusive fees for solemn first instance proceedings);

slightly amending the new Part I as regards the detailed fees arrangements; and

introducing, for the first time, inclusive fees for solemn first instance proceedings.

A copy of Schedule 1, as amended, is attached for ease of reference.

The terms of the Criminal Legal Aid (Scotland) (Fees Regulations 1989 remain largely unchanged. In particular, regulation 7(1) continues to state,

"(1) Subject to the provisions of regulation 4, 5, 6 and 9, a solicitor shall be allowed such amount of fees and shall be determined to be reasonable remuneration for work actually and reasonably done, and travel and waiting time actually and reasonably undertaken or incurred, due regard being had to economy. The fees allowed shall be calculated in accordance with Schedule 1".

The provisions for submission of accounts (regulation 9) and taxation of fees and outlays (regulation 11) remain unchanged.

The effect of the new Part II of the Table of Fees is to introduce what can be referred to as a "hybrid" Table of Fees which result in the solicitor providing criminal legal aid charging for work partly by way of inclusive (block) fees and partly by way of detailed charges.

Note 1(1) provides that in relation to solemn criminal proceedings the fee for -

(a) all work falling within a block of work prescribed in Part II of the Table of Fees is the fee specified in the relevant column of that Part;

(b) any items of work that does no: fall within a block of work prescribed in Part II of the Table of Fees is to be calculated in accordance with Part I of the Table of Fees.

The default position in respect of the new scheme is that, unless otherwise provided, all work falling within a block of work as prescribed can only be charged as a block fee. Otherwise, where any item of work does not fall within a block of work so prescribed, can the solicitor revert to detailed fees.

Note 1(5), without prejudice to the generality of sub-paragraph (1) sets out items of work which do not fall within any block of work prescribed in Part II of the Table of Fees.

This includes, importantly, all work in respect of time spent waiting in court or conducting, or attending court. Representation in court is always a matter of detailed feeing.

### Fees claimed & offers made

As indicated, two issues arise in this taxation and will be dealt with separately.

The charging of the prison block

The inclusive fee at Part II, paragraph 3 (the prison block) is payable in the following circumstances,

"3. The fee for arranging and attending all meetings, including consultations, in prison with the client after full committal for trial up to the conclusion of the case". The correct fee in the circumstances of this case is the fee set out in column B, £304.

The starting point, in the process, for charging this fee is "after full committal for trial". The reason for this is that the higher fee prescribed at paragraph 1(b) (the petition fee) anticipates the likelihood of a prison visit between the client being committed for further examination and, usually about a week later, being fully committed.

The end point is the point in dispute. It is the Board's contention that the reference to "the conclusion of the case" for the purpose of this particular inclusive fee relates to the point at which the accused person is convicted. The principle being that there should be no overlap between the respective inclusive fees.

In addition, paragraph 1(5)(h) on the Notes on the operation of Schedule 1 is designed to specifically allow for "post conviction work, except for the work described in paragraph 5 of Part 2 of the Table of Fees" to be charged on a detailed basis. By definition only work which falls outwith the Inclusive Fee in paragraph 5 of Part 2 can be charged, in addition.

It is understood that in this case the nominated solicitor attended a meeting with the client in prison, the client having previously been at liberty up until conviction, between the date of conviction and the date of sentencing. The solicitor believes that the terms of

paragraph 3 are sufficiently wide to include this one attendance as initiating and justifying the claim. The Board's view is that the Schedule and the respective Tables of Fees have to be read as a whole and in the context of the other fees prescribed. Paragraph 5 draws a line at the stage of conviction, prescribing a fee (£152 in this case) for all work undertaken after the date of conviction. This would include the attendance with the client in prison. Paragraph 5 states

"5. The fee for all work in connection with post-conviction discussions and advice that, including advising and giving an opinion on the prospects of any appeal".

The Board believes that it is clear from the terms of Part II of the Table of Fees, reading paragraphs 3 and 5 together, that the attendance with the client in prison is part of the post-conviction work and cannot be charged separately by reference either to a detailed fee or, in this case, another block.

Claim for preparation fee: paragraph 4(b)

Part II, paragraph 4 of the Tables of Fees states

"4. The fee for preparation, including citing and settling with witnesses, perusing evidence and preparing lines of enquiry and submissions but excluding relative consultations, in respect of -


(a) the first day of trial;

(b) a subsequent day of trial or diet of deferred sentence".

Reference is also made to the Notes on the operation of Schedule 1 and, in particular, note 3(k) to (m) which set out the circumstances in which the fees prescribed by paragraph 4 are chargeable.

In properly interpreting the scope of these fees, we believe that context is everything. The inclusive fee prescribed by paragraph 4 clearly relates to the circumstances surrounding the preparation for trial and the ancillary/supplementary fee prescribed by 4(b) (and the alternative set within) must be read in this context.

The Board believes that the way in which it has implemented the new Table of Fees is entirely consistent with the lengthy discussions with the Law Society and the Profession, the costings undertaken from time-to-time (shared with the Law Society, available to the profession on its website and the regulations).
